Many parents and guardians are also members of Parent Councils, Boards of Governors and Boards of Management making a direct and valuable contribution to the administration and management of the schools.

In addition, parents and guardians provide valuable support in promoting the values of Sacred Heart Education.

This support is welcome and can manifest itself in many ways such as:

 Nurturing and promoting a sense of respect for these values, both in the school environment and at home.

- Having direct involvement with the school community.

THE ORIGINS

The strong link between Sacred Heart Schools finds its primary expression through our **Network of Sacred Heart Schools**. The links between our schools come, not only from history and our common origins, but from the shared experience of a living tradition.

Over time it was recognised that the common vision shared by all Sacred Heart Schools needed to be reformulated for modern times. Successive Provincial Councils of the Irish-Scottish Province have guided and supported a continuous process of review and renewal for schools in the tradition of the Society of the Sacred Heart. The five Goals of faith, character, intellect, community and social awareness are given expression through our document Heritage & Horizon, which was relaunched in March 2010 in the presence of Mary McAleese, President of Ireland. The work of our schools in observing and propagating the ethos of Sacred Heart Education with our pupils and in our school communities is directed by the office of the **Network of Sacred** Heart Schools.

ENDURING VALUES

We see these characteristics as representing and giving life to a set of enduring values which link us back to Sophie's time and bring us forward confidently into the future. Our **Network of Sacred Heart Schools** actively promotes the transmission of shared values through workshops for staff and senior management teams, regular meetings of heads of schools and through the publication of **Heritage and Horizon**.

OUR GOALS

This current edition of **Heritage and Horizon** expresses our basic values in terms of five Goals;

FAITH

The Irish-Scottish Province Network of Sacred Heart Schools

The **Network of Sacred Heart Schools** was set up by the Provincial Council of the Irish-Scottish Province in 1997. The office is based in Mount Anville House at Mount Anville, in Dublin.

The Network Office provides services and support to Sacred Heart Schools as they work to implement the core values of Sacred Heart Education. The office provides in-service training and induction for staff of the various schools, organises annual conferences for Heads and Deputies, termly meetings for school co-ordinators and facilitates inter-school contact, visits and shared curricular projects. Our schools are located in: Armagh, Dublin, Roscrea, Malta and Scotland.

Each school in the Network works on the implementation of the same Goal in the same school year. This is done in a spirit of co-operation and sharing which is underpinned by a common vision and a commitment to the philosophy of Sacred Heart Education. Creative and innovative ideas on how to make the implementation of the various Goals a reality are freely shared.

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
